

Junior Players in Open Age Group Cricket – Consent Form

Making the step up from junior to open age group cricket is a significant event in any player's cricket experience. This step should not be taken lightly, and great care must be given before allowing children to play adult cricket.

The ECB has issued guidance covering the selection and participation of young players in open age group cricket. This can be found in the ECB Safe Hands Guidance document.

Remember, children's early experiences will remain with them always and will often determine whether they want to remain playing the game or give up and do something else – only allow them to play senior cricket if you are of the belief that the experience will not be detrimental to their development. Further, that involvement will not have a detrimental effect on them physically or mentally or expose them to inappropriate risk.

In coming to this decision, Cricket Wales expects that consultation and written approval (where necessary) from their Parent/Guardian, age group Coach and Club Safeguarding Officer will be obtained.

Eligibility

Players who are selected in **Wales** or **Regional** U12 squads in spring for a summer squad for that season are eligible to play open age cricket. That is providing they are at least 11 years old, are in School Year 7 on 1st September in the year preceding the season, and have <u>written parental</u> <u>consent to play</u>.

- This means children who are in Wales or Regional squads, can play open age group cricket if they are in an U12 age group and are a minimum of 11 years old on 1st September of the year preceding the season.
- Club cricketers who are not in Welsh or Regional squads must wait until they reach the U13 age group, be in Year 8 and be 12 years old on 1st September of the preceding year before being able to play in any open age group cricket. As before <u>written parental consent is</u> required for these players.
- Children who are in Year 9 and 13 years of age on 1st of September of the preceding year are eligible to play without written parental consent and this form need not be completed.

Where written consent is required, this must be obtained from the Parent/Guardian, Accredited Regional Coach (ECB Level 2 or higher) and the Club Safeguarding Officer prior to being authorised to play in open age/adult cricket.

For the purpose of this guidance, Regional squads are limited to Cricket Wales **North**, CW **West**, CW **East** and CW **South**. This includes **Main** and **Development** squads.

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- I give my consent that in an emergency situation, the club may act in my place (Loco Parentis), if the need arises for the administration of emergency first aid and/or other medical treatment which may be necessary.
- > I confirm that I will advise the club Captain of any medical issues for my child before play commences.

Consent to participate: I agree to the child named above taking part in adult/open age cricket.
