- Recruit, and work closely with members of the CWW coaching team (potential to coach as well) in the two satellite centres to ensure a high quality environment
- Lead communications and feedback with players and parents throughout the year
- Work closely with the Head of Talent Pathway and National Age Group Coaches to ensure clarity on selection and coaching practices
- Foster and maintain strong relationships with players, parents, clubs and the Area team
- Manage the regional pathway budget in accordance with the Head of Talent Pathway
- Assist the Head of Talent Pathway in Coach and Club CPD & Parental Development
- Any further duties that the Head of Talent Pathway sees fit, providing that such duties are appropriate to the role

### **REMUNERATION AND ROLE LOCATION**

Location: Flexible (from home, but also frequently across the CWW area and at times, Cardiff)

**Salary:** £18,500 per annum (25 hours per week) – additional paid coaching work within the region may also be available.

**Contract:** 8 months initially, to be extended subject to funding.
